EXPLANATION OF THE APPLICATION PROCESS

for the Fairbanks Carpenter Apprenticeship Program

THE MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS TO APPLY ARE:

- 18 years of age
- High school diploma or GED equivalency
- Shall be physically capable of performing the essential functions of the occupation without endangering themselves and/or fellow workers.

Interested persons should pick up an application, during the specified period, at the Fairbanks Carpenter Training Center located at 6 Timberland Drive, Fairbanks, Alaska, during normal business hours; Monday through Friday 8:00am – 4:00pm.

Applicants living 50 miles or more outside of Fairbanks may mail, email, or fax a written request for an application. The request should include the following information:

1. Your name, address, and phone number
2. A brief statement requesting that an application be sent to you.
3. Print your name and sign and date your request letter. Please make sure all information is clearly legible.

The recruitment, selection, employment, and training of apprentices during their apprenticeship shall be without discrimination because of race, color, religion, national origin, or sex.

Required Documents:

1. Transcript of high school courses, including grades
2. High school diploma or GED equivalency certificate with scores
3. Copy of birth certificate
4. Copy of birth certificate
5. Veteran's DD214, if applicable. If you were never in the military service this does not apply to you.
6. Valid driver's license or the ability to obtain one by May 20th, 2019

Applications: We only accept completed applications

Interviews: Interviews take place annually, usually around the end of the March or beginning of April. A time and date for an interview will be assigned to each applicant. You will be contact by certified mail notifying you of the date. Interviews last about 15 minutes each.

Ranking List: Applicants will be scored based on their application and interview. They will then be placed on a ranking list according to their score. This list will be maintained for two (2) years from the date of the interview.

Selections: Selections will be made as needed, beginning with the highest score on the ranking list. If you are not selected, your application is kept for five (5) years and your ranking is kept for two (2) years. In that two year period, you may update your application for a better ranking score.

Training: If you are accepted into the apprenticeship program you will be required to attend your first year of training at the carpenters training center in Fairbanks beginning in May and lasting approximately six (6) weeks.

- Class are held Monday through Friday, 7:00am – 3:30pm
- Students are not paid while in class
- Tuition of \$750.00 will be due the first day of class
- Tuition will cover books, first year tools, and other items
- Students will be required to have work clothing including gloves, steel-toed work boots, and rain gear. No loose or baggy clothing.

Job Placement: Upon completion of the six (6) weeks of training, students will be sent to work as an "Apprentice Carpenter" with various union construction companies in Fairbanks or the surrounding areas. Starting wages are around \$23.00 per hour. This amount represents 60% of the Journeyman wage. For every 875 hours that an apprentice works they receive a 5% pay increase.

Schooling/OJT Requirements: During the next three (3) years apprentices will continue to come to class, during the winter months, for training that lasts approximately six (6) weeks each year. They may then return to work, if work is available. Apprentice carpenters must complete the four (4) years of schooling (1,040 hours total) and work between 6,000 to 7,000 hours on the job to complete the apprenticeship program and receive their Journeyman's certificate. It normally takes about five (5) years to complete the program.
